### SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

### 1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS 2013-2016), the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.

### 2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the Cowes Corinthian Yacht Club foyer.
- 2.2 The Race Committee may use VHF channel 8 to communicate information such as courses, safety issues, location of the committee boat and time checks.
- 2.3 If VHF channel 8 is busy then another channel, (6,9,10,13,15,72,73,77, or M2) may be used instead.

### 3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted no later than 2 hours before the first scheduled race on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 on the day before it will take effect.

### 4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the CCYC flagpole above the clubhouse.

### 5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

# 5.1 Dates of racing:

One extra race per day may be sailed.

There will be a Skippers briefing at 08:00 on the Saturday morning in the CCYC marquee.

- After a long postponement, to alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, an orange flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is displayed.
- 5.3 Subsequent race sequences will start approximately 10 minutes after the last boat finishes. On the last scheduled day of the event no warning signal will be made after 14:00.

### 6 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be:

#### 7 RACING AREAS

7.1 The course areas will be The Central, Eastern and Western Solent.

#### 8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 Laid courses will be signalled by the codes letters shown in the diagrams in Attachment A, which include the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 8.2 A-Round the cans courses will consist of a series of fixed or laid marks, all are rounding marks. Charts of permanent racing mark locations and the letter, number or symbol designated to each will be available from the Club office and on the Club website they are also attached to these Si's, they may be posted on the official notice board. The marks of the course may be read out on the selected VHF Channel prior to the warning signal.
- 8.3 An orange or red letter, number or symbol indicates that mark will be rounded to port.
- 8.4 A green or yellow letter, number or symbol indicates that mark will be rounded to starboard.
- 8.3 No later than the warning signal, the race committee boat will display the course to be sailed on the starboard side of the Committee Boat, and may indicate the bearing of the first windward mark.

### 9 MARKS

- 9.1 Laid marks will be Orange inflatable cylinders. Fixed marks will be selected from the navigation and racing buoys listed in these Sailing Instructions.
- 9.2 New marks, as provided in instruction 12.1, will be Black inflatable marks with a yellow stripe.
- 9.3 The starting and finishing marks will be Orange inflatable marks.
- A race committee boat signalling a change of a leg of the course is a mark as provided in sailing instruction 12.3.

### 10 AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

During 2015 Vessels transiting between the Solent and Cowes Harbour need to be aware of the construction of the outer breakwater and the consequent *exclusion zone*. ### 11 THE START

- 11.1 Races will be started by using rule 26.
- The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat and an Orange inflatable mark. An inner distance marker IDM may be laid. Optionally a pin end boat with orange staff may indicate the pin end of the line.
- 11.3 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes rules A4 and A5.
- The Race Committee may use VHF radio to communicate to the Fleet, including the starting area, countdown to the start, OCS bow/sail numbers (to be communicated at least 30 seconds after the start), general recalls, black flag, DSQs and Postponements. Failure to make these broadcasts or failure to hear them shall not constitute grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1

# 12 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

12.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. The new mark will be Black with a yellow stripe; subsequent marks will be original marks. When in a subsequent change, a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark. Changing Race Signal flag 'C' and RRS 33 the position of any laid inflated mark(s) may be adjusted by up to plus or minus 10 degrees relative to the previous laid mark(s) and up to approximately 500 metres to windward or leeward without signalling of code flag 'C' or '+' or '-'.

- Except at a gate, boats shall pass between the race committee boat signalling the change of the next leg and the nearby mark, leaving the mark to port and the race committee boat to starboard. This changes rule 28.1.
- 12.3 If a '#' or '+' is displayed boats shall proceed directly to the **finish line** directly from that mark.

### 13 THE FINISH

13.1 The finishing line will be between a staff or hoist displaying a blue flag on the committee boat and the nearby ODM of the start finish line, or the last mark of the course.

### 14 PENALTY SYSTEM

- Rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by a One Turn Penalty (one tack and one gybe in the same direction).
- A boat that may have broken a rule of RRS Part 2, or RRS 31 or RRS 42, may, after finishing the race concerned and before the start of a related protest hearing, notify the Race Committee that she accepts a 20% scoring penalty as stated in RRS 44.3(c), (except that the minimum penalty is two places if that does not result in a score worse than DNF). This penalty does not reverse an OCS score, a disqualification under RRS 30.3 or a penalty under RRS Appendix P. It is not available for a breach of RRS 2 or of class rules or for gross misconduct under RRS 69. Nor is it available to a boat that caused injury or serious damage, or gained a significant advantage by her breach: in these circumstances, her penalty is to retire.
- 14.3. When an Exoneration Penalty is accepted:
  - (a) Neither the boat nor a Protest Committee may then revoke or remove the penalty.
  - (b) The boat shall not be penalized further in a protest hearing when the Protest Committee decides that it was appropriate to the facts found and the applicable rules.

### 15 TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

15.1 Time limits and target times are as follows:

If no boat has passed Mark 1 within the Mark 1 time limit the race maybe abandoned. Failure to meet the target time will not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).

Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes may be awarded a finishing position or DNF (Did Not Finish) without a hearing to; enable further races to be sailed, or allow racing to be concluded. This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

## 16 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 16.1 Protest forms are available in the CCYC foyer near the official notice board. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered to the Race Officer or Race Office within the appropriate time limit.
- 16.2 The protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day.
- Notices will be posted as soon as possible after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room, located at the CCYC, beginning at the time posted.
- Notices of protests by the race committee or protest committee will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).

- Penalties for breaches of rules, except RRS Part 1&2 and other rules are at discretion of the Protest Committee.
- 16.6 RYA Rules Dispute Advisory and Mediation Hearings maybe available.
- 16.7 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered
  - (a) within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day:
  - (b) no later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day.

This changes rule 66.

On the last scheduled day of racing a request for redress based on a protest committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes rule 62.2.

### 17 SCORING

17.1 The minimum number of races required to complete the series is 2. If 4 or more races are sailed there will be 1 discard.

### 18 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- All boats shall sail on starboard tack close to the stern of the Committee Boat and hail their sail number prior to the start of the first race each day.
- A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible on the selected VHF channel, Mobile 07734274802, or by hailing an official regatta support boat/rib.
- 18.3. It is for the boat to decide whether she is fit to sail in the conditions in which she will find herself. By going to sea, the boat confirms that she is fit for those conditions and that her crew is competent to sail and compete in them.
- 18.4. Nothing done by the organisers can reduce the responsibility of the boat nor will it make the organisers responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury, however it may have occurred, as a result of the boat taking part in the racing. The organisers encompass everyone helping to run the race and the event, and include the Organizing Authority, the Race Committee, the race officer, safety boats and shore-side support.

### 19 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

19.1 No authorisation is required for the substitution of crew or equipment, except as required by Class rules.

# 20 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

Some scrutineering will be carried out by the Impala Class Association to ensure that boats comply with the One Design rules.

### 22 OFFICIAL BOATS


Official boats will be marked as follows: committee vessels and RIBs will have the CCYC lettering displayed and fly the club burgee.

23.1 There are no restrictions on support boats.


### 24 PRIZES

24.1 Prizes will be as specified by the Class Association.




